Thanks to all of you who have been loyal Friends of the Mansfield Library. Because of your support, our library offers an incredible variety of programs and materials.

Many people know that the Friends Fund The Summer reading program and many of the childrens' and adult programs throughout the year, but those are only a fraction of the funds we provide. The outdoor covered area; the toys/tools/baking pans to borrow; the vegetable garden; museum passes; genealogy/ language/learning software; the blackout shades in the auditorium; the guinea pig and her supplies; the annual ice cream social; even some of the display shelves custom built by a local carpenter are all thanks to Friends funds. Now that you know how much you help to support, we hope that you will renew your membership this year.

Memberships renew on October 1st of each year. To keep up with the rising cost of everything, beginning in October 2019, dues will increase from \$5 per year, as they have been since 1973, to \$10 per year for a family membership.

#### Friends' Sale Shelf



If you are one of the many who enjoy the book sales and wish they could occur more often, we remind you of the mini book sale happening continually on the Friend's sale shelf at the library. The shelf is just inside the entrance and is surprisingly easy to overlook as you walk in with your hands full of books and/or children. Its

size and location make it easy to take a quick look on your way in or out. There are hardcover fiction books for adults and paperback chapter books and picture books for children. On the top shelf there is a bin of small pamphlets and books, and another bin whose contents changes with the seasons. You'll also find magazines, jigsaw puzzles, and travel books. Prices are listed on the front of the shelf and there is a slot for payment on the top which you can also use to renew your membership or make a donation.

Friends board members are responsible for stocking the shelves and we ask that if you wish to donate books or puzzles to the shelf that you follow the normal donation process and bring the books to the employee entrance during business hours. We request that people not leave promotional literature, flyers or coupons on the shelf.

Don't forget to check out the honor paperback racks located near the circulation desk. The Friends stock the racks with paperbacks that are free for the taking. Patrons can also place books on the rack when they are finished with them.

#### Be "Resource"ful

ou know about the wide variety of items that your library can lend? The list includes museum passes, cakepans, tools, games and puzzles, cuddly puppets and popular online databases. One database that has been frequently accessed is ancestry.com. Library patrons are surprised at the amount of information that can be researched without DNA (available only through a personal subscription). According to the library's webpage, database records include federal censuses, military service, taxes, immigration and naturalization information, certificates of birth, marriage and death, as well as landholdings and wills. In addition, files such as "stories, memories and histories," "photographs" and "maps and atlases" can add historical context to your family's history. Detailed information and a variety of quick links help you to refine your search. Please note that this is a library edition and can be accessed only inside the library.

Dig deeper into your family's history to discover ancestral skeletons in your closet, relatives you didn't know existed, or people with whom you would like to reconnect. Go to mansfieldpubliclibraryct.org and click on "research."


